
In this newsletter you will find listed the recipients of all the different awards. Congratulations to all these students and their families.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO MOTORISTS
RE: SCHOOL BUS ZONES IN RIFLE
RANGE ROAD

Please be aware that the School Bus Zones in Rifle Range Road are as follows:

- The existing bus bay near the main car park gate is now a School Bus Zone on School Days from 8:00am-9:30am and 2:30pm-4:00pm. Therefore other than buses - any vehicle parking or stopping in this bus bay for any purpose during these times is doing so illegally. Clear signage has been erected reading "NO ENTRY - BUSES EXCEPTED" to warn motorists of this change.
- 2. The former School Bus Zone located near the Front Gate has been converted to a Full Time Bus Zone. Clear signage has been erected to warn motorists of this change. Therefore other than buses, any vehicle parking or stopping for any purpose in the School Bus Zone at any time, is doing so illegally.

The Year 11 Peer Support leaders guided and taught Year 7 about "Thoughts, Outcomes, Challenges and Wellbeing". During the session open and limiting thoughts were discussed, this helped the Year 7 students to distinguish between open and limiting thoughts or ideals they had about themselves and how negative or positive thoughts would impact their thinking throughout high school.

As session three was combined with session four, ideas and challenges such as what strengths we have and making plans were incorporated also into the session. Year 7 students had the opportunity to remind themselves that open thoughts would help with a positive outlook on school. They were also encouraged to ask questions about what to do if feeling overwhelmed. The second Peer Support session was enjoyable and the Peer Support leaders look forward to the next one.

Scheyville "camp" has a long and varied history including a farm training centre for young people, an "alien" internment camp in WW1, an Army parachute training camp in WW11 and immediately thereafter became a migrant reception camp for newcomers to Australia. More recently it was again occupied by Army as the National Service Office Training Unit during the Vietnam War. Scheyville has indeed been many things (only some mentioned above) and is now part of the NSW National Parks & Wildlife Service.

We have been fortunate in being able to conduct our static display on the former Parade Ground.

Owners of former military vehicles (registered or historic plates) are invited to attend.

Local RFS Oakville unit will be joining the display with their current RFS units / equipment / display (for the kids) & their veteran Studebaker & Blitz tankers. They will also supply catering with bacon & egg rolls, sausage sandwiches & refreshments etc. at modest cost.
