



Skoolbag

Smartphone school to parent communication

Skoolbag is a mobile App for your school to communicate directly to both devices (such as iPads and Android Tablets). Ideal for:

- > School, free push notification alerts
- > School events
- > School newsletters
- > School documents
- > School RSS feeds
- > School social media (Facebook, Twitter)



How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

iPhone & iPad Users

- 1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
- 2. Type your school name in the search, using suburb name will help.
- 3. If iPhone, you will see your school appear, click "Free" then "install".
- 4. If iPad, change the drop list to "iPhone Apps", your school will then be visible, click "Free" then "install".
- 5. When installed click "Open"
- 6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.





Android Users

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

- 1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device
- 2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using suburb name will help.
- 3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
- 4. Click the "Install" button.
- 5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
- 6. Click "Open" when installed.
- 7. Click the "More" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.

IMPORTANT NOTICES:

Recharging Mobile Devices:

All students are asked to ensure that their mobile devices are fully charged before they arrive at the College each day.

Illegal U Turn:

All parents and students are warned that making a U turn out of the bus bay on Rifle Range Rd is illegal. We bring this to your attention as making this turn is very unsafe, even when the 40kmh limit applies. Please do not make this turn.

This has been reported to police who will issue penalty notices to those offending.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO MOTORISTS RE: SCHOOL BUS ZONES IN RIFLE RANGE ROAD

Please be aware that the School Bus Zones in Rifle Range Road are as follows:

- The existing bus bay near the main car park gate is now a School Bus Zone on School Days from 8:00am-9:30am and 2:30pm-4:00pm. Therefore other than buses any vehicle parking or stopping in this bus bay for any purpose during these times is doing so illegally. Clear signage has been erected reading "NO ENTRY BUSES EXCEPTED" to warn motorists of this change.
- 2. The former School Bus Zone located near the Front Gate has been converted to a Full Time Bus Zone. Clear signage has been erected to warn motorists of this change. Therefore other than buses, any vehicle parking or stopping for any purpose in the School Bus Zone at any time, is doing so illegally.

IMPORTANT NOTICE DROP OFF/PICK UP

For safety reasons parents are asked NOT to drive onto the school grounds to drop off or pick up students before 9:30am and after 2:30pm. The ONLY EXCEPTION to this is for students with disabilities. Thank you

Year 10 Visual Arts/Photography & Digital Media Bundanon/Riversdale Excursion

Participating in the Bundanon excursion was a truly eventful and personal trip. I participated in both Visual Arts and Photography workshops, in which I took a valuable lesson away.

On the first day, I chose to participate in the Visual Arts first workshop. In this workshop we walked down to the Shoalhaven River which is the same river that Arthur Boyd sat along to create his artworks. Using ink, water, a quill, paintbrush and paper, we observed the landscape to paint, splatter and explore ourselves as artists in such a quiet and peaceful environment. The end results were amazing and magnificent. We each focused on different areas and used our own imagination to apply different techniques.

The tour of Arthur Boyd's homestead was educational. The house exhibited some of his works as well as paintings and ceramics of his mother and father. What I really enjoyed was Boyd's studio. It was left in its original state when he passed and every colour was still as strong as it would have been back then.

After this both Art and Photography students got to meet Gina Kalabishis, an Australian artist who was staying at Bundanon trust. We were able to see her in action using pastels and charcoal on her unfinished artwork which was truly a one-off experience.

When we arrived at Riversdale to stay at the beautiful architectural building designed by Glen Murcutt, where we would stay the night, free time was spent exploring the rooms and surrounding area. The next day I partook in the Photography workshop which was called 'Photography with Skulls'. A basic name but was the literal truth. Using Wombat, Cow and other dead animal skulls and skeletal pieces we explored a small creek area. Photographers were taken out of their comfort zone to pick up and place skulls in the natural environment; whether it be in the water, on rocks and vines. We explored different shutter speeds, aperture levels and camera angles to capture various shots. The surreal material, mixed in with such a wondrous environment, was purely individual and inspiring. When we had completed this task, photography students were then given time back around the building to use both the skulls and precious stones and other glittery objects. Many wandered down to the river to take photos.

Overall, the excursion was amazing. Everyone took a lot of personal techniques and experiences away to develop their artistic and photographic practice.



Meningococcal ACWY Vaccination Program

Earlier this year, the Minster for Health announced the inclusion of the meningococcal ACWY vaccine in the NSW School Vaccination Program. In 2017, this vaccine will be offered to all Year 11 and 12 students.

Meningococcal disease is a rare but serious illness that can present as meningitis (inflammation of the lining of the brain and spinal cord) or septicaemia (blood poisoning) and may be caused by one of several serogroups (or types), including A, B, C, W and Y. Use of meningococcal C vaccine on the National Immunisation Program has almost eradicated meningococcal C disease in Australia.

Meningococcal W has emerged as a significant cause of invasive meningococcal disease with the number of cases almost tripling in NSW in 2016 compared to 2015. Evidence from Australia and overseas suggest that meningococcal disease caused by serotype W is significantly more severe than the other serotypes currently circulating in Australia. NSW Health immunisation nurses will be attending Bede Polding College on Wednesday, 17 May 2017.

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/guardians at the beginning of Term 2. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- read all the information provided
- complete the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s they would like their child to receive
- return the completed consent form to their child's school
- ensure that their child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic. Parents/guardians should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.
