Unischools Steer Competition



The Unischools Steer Competition is a yearly highlight for numerous agriculture students, from years 7 to 12, across 14 participating schools from all across the greater Sydney area. The competition, an initiative of Western Sydney University, involves each school receiving a Poll Hereford steer in which they have 100 days to train, feed, and care in order to produce the best quality steer possible. The competition gives students a firsthand insight into the production of beef products, as well as an opportunity to develop skills in animal handling, show preparation, judging and parading. These skills are put to the test at the competitions conclusion, 'live day'. Live day this year was held on the 12th of August at Hawkesbury Showgrounds, seeing 14 steers and 100's of students and teachers come together for a day a fierce competition.

The Bede Ag Show team, under the guidance of Miss Leva, had an extremely successful day of competition with our steer 'Malachi', placing in all classes. Malachi, paraded by Sharne Haskins, was awarded 'Champion Best Presented' in the first class of the day. Our success was continued in the second class with Malachi, led by Ryan Carpenter, being presented 'Best Led Steer'.





After the conclusion of the steer classes the focus turned to the paraders with 4 of Bede's best cattle paraders being put to the challenge across 4 highly competitive classes. Harry Hicks placed 4th in the Junior Novice paraders whilst Georgia Haskins placed 3rd in the Junior Experienced. Lenise Mantell was deemed the best Senior Novice parader, being awarded first prize whilst Sharne Haskins was presented with 4th place in the Senior Experienced class.





As these paraders skills were challenged in the ring, various other competitions were also being conducted. Our Junior Judges, Samantha Gauci and Isabella Sciberras, as well as our Senior Judges, Ryan Carpenter and Thea Brailey, assessed 2 groups of cattle and presented their judgements, which will be compared with the rulings of the official judges, to find the best Junior and Senior Judges. Junior Herdsman Cameron Bird and Senior Herdsman Sharne Haskins were tested on their knowledge of the event as well as Malachi's feeding, training and overall progress over the 100 days, whilst presenting our schools display to other schools and the public. Our Junior and Senior Beef Appraisal teams also competed, assessing the various cattle in regards to their rib score, eye muscle area and fat coverage. The results of these events, as well as the carcass judging results and overall champion school, will be presented at the closing ceremony to be held in early September.

The Unischools steer competition is a great way to learn about agriculture and the world of cattle showing. Participating in this competition and achieving such great success though is not possible without the tireless efforts of Miss Leva, as well as all the students who helped out over the 100 days. The Bede Ag Show team will be looking to continue our success at the upcoming Penrith Show, before finding out the final results of the Unischools Steer Competition. If you are interested in getting involved with the Bede Ag Group and Show Team, applications will open again in 2018 and the Unischools Steer Competition Training Day will be held in May 2018, for selected students.

Learning and Teaching Report - Rodney Howard

Year 9 NAPLAN results and the HSC minimum standard

HSC minimum standard required to receive the HSC from 2020

Literacy and numeracy skills are the foundation for success in life after school. This is why eligibility for the HSC is changing. From 2020, students will need to show they have the basic literacy and numeracy skills needed to complete everyday tasks.

Your child will have many chances from Year 9 to Year 12, and even after the HSC to show they meet the HSC minimum standard

Some students will meet the requirement early through their Year 9 NAPLAN results in reading, writing and numeracy. However, most students will show they meet the standard by passing short, online reading, writing and numeracy tests in Years 10, 11 or 12. You can watch a short video that explains

Year 9 NAPLAN results and the new online HSC minimum standard tests at www.educationstandards.nsw.edu.au

Year 9 NAPLAN reports available in mid-August

Your child's Year 9 NAPLAN report will indicate which online HSC minimum standard test/s (if any) they will need to pass to be eligible for the HSC certificate. Remember your child has three more years of

learning before the HSC and can take the HSC minimum standard online tests in Years 10, 11 or 12. Year 9 NAPLAN is a good chance to check they are on track or get support to meet the minimum standard by Year 12.

If your child has achieved a Band 8 or above in reading, writing or numeracy, the NAPLAN report will

indicate that they have "Met the HSC minimum standard early" in the respective area/s.

Your child can sit the online HSC minimum standard tests when they are ready

There are three separate 45 minute online tests: reading, writing and numeracy. Students don't have to pass all three tests at once and can attempt each test up to twice a year.

The reading and numeracy tests each contain a maximum of 45 multiple choice questions.

The writing test will require students to respond to a question about a prompt or stimulus.

- 8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you.





Android Users

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.
